2022 was a year of firsts for ASPSH while learning more about what members value from our organization. The 14th Biennial Conference 'Synergies of Sexuality: Seeing the Whole Person (postponed from 2020) was the first hybrid conference for us and was a success. Despite a few technical hiccups the format received very positive feedback as we hosted both in-person in Calgary and online. Many participants from across Canada enjoyed presentations from practitioners and academics reporting on innovative programs and developments in the field of sexual health and wellness. A sold-out Sexual Attitude Reassessment Training (SAR) was also held in-person a few days before the conference. A big thank you goes out to the Conference Committee for putting together an engaging and diverse program. It is worth noting that our committee is volunteer led and driven by enthusiasm to create an excellent experience for attendees.

In the fall of 2022 ASPSH hosted a webinar with Chevi Rabbit, a public Educator, artist and Cree Trans Woman from Alberta. Chevi connected with ASPSH members and guests online to discuss her advocacy challenges and triumphs.

ASPSH is well known for our online workshops that provide current, evidence-informed discussion to support professionals to de-stigmatize sexuality in their communities. We have offered over 200 online workshops to members and non-members to date. The topics continue to be varied and engaging and new workshops show the commitment to continue to connect and share. A new summer program was offered as another method of delivery allowing for even more flexibility for participants. Thank you once again to Melanie, our Education Coordinator, for continuing to foster and develop relationships with our facilitators and members to make the workshops a success.

ASPSH is governed and operated by a committed and vibrant volunteer group of directors who bring their knowledge, expertise, and professional passion to the Board of Directors. Without them our organization could not continue to promote inclusive and responsive sexual health and wellness programs. EDUCATION COORDINATOR'S REPORT

Our fiscal year 2022-2023 was another interesting year of changes for ASPSH. We held our first hybrid conference and we lost some Board members but acquired some new ones. Meanwhile the online workshops remained ASPSH's anchor program but the number of participants continued to reflect 'virtual/online fatigue' as our numbers lagged behind previous years. Over the course of the year we offered 17 online workshops with a total participation of 153, averaging about 9 participants per workshop. The positive news is that we are reaching people right across Canada. My very sincere and heartfelt thanks to all of the workshop facilitators and participants who continue to support our workshops.

We held our first hybrid conference on April 28 and 29, 2022. Thanks to our Vice President, Dr. Shaniff Esmail, and the UofA's Occupational Therapy program we were able to utilize classroom space at the University of Calgary's downtown campus for those who attended in-person. The opportunity for people, both presenters and attendees, to participate in the conference virtually was an added bonus and significantly increased our conference attendance numbers. Although we encountered some challenges behind the scenes with an unfamiliar technology, no-one seemed to notice and the evaluations bore out the positivity of a hybrid conference.

Our casino was held in June in Edmonton and our deep felt gratitude goes out to all the volunteers who came forward to help and especially Angel Sumka and her friends from ASPECC who provided us with so much support.

Unfortunately our pre-conference event with Chevi Rabbit was canceled and rescheduled for October. Due to unforeseen circumstances, Chevi was unable to attend the hybrid event in-person and instead it became a virtual event demonstrating once again the flexibility that technology can offer us.

Emily Diaczun left our Board in mid-term this past year and I would like to personally thank her for always responding to our call for help over the years. Special thanks to the current Board of Directors and most particularly President Heather Cobb. Heather is the hardest working, most dedicated President/Board member I have ever worked with (and I have been around for a very long time). She is the rudder that keeps the ASPSH ship afloat and I am so very grateful for her tireless leadership and professionalism.
